The Times, They are A-changin'

Sure, these words are taken from a famous Bob Dylan tune from many years ago, but they also could be the new mantra for Coconut Creek and our Regency Lakes community.

The city of Coconut Creek no longer is the sleepy little town situated in the north end of the County that housed lots of small horse farms, trailer parks, Butterfly World, and row after row of auto dealerships. Today we are a vibrant, active city that has grown substantially. The horse farms have been transformed into lovely housing developments, the trailer parks are slowly fading away as the city landscape continues to change. The growth and construction persists: new homes, schools, industrial parks, shopping centers, even a gaming Mecca as the Coconut Creek Casino expansion project is underway. A super Wal-Mart store will be erected at the corner of Hillsboro Blvd. and State Road 7, creating more traffic on our already swelling roads.

As our community has evolved – so has Regency Lakes. Approximately 11 years ago when our first homes were built, vacant land and trees surrounded us. There was no need for a traffic light at our front entryway. Now our Regency Lakes Blvd. front entrance serves as the inroad to schools, a park, gas stations and two shopping centers as well as our homes. Additionally, our children gather near the guardhouse to await pick-up from school buses. This has become a very congested area with heavy traffic that promises to become only worse. As more stores open in the new center, we anticipate a problem as shoppers use Regency Lakes Blvd. as their entry and exit point. Soon the hustle and bustle of the holiday season starts, we stress to you to please, please, exercise caution when you drive through this area.

Keeping in stride with the changes that encircle us and their effects to our community, our Safety & Security Committee recommended that we modify our gate access







system. After much discussion and deliberation, the Board of Directors accepted the committee's proposal that a new design be put into place. Work is currently under way to upgrade the system and it should be finished shortly. You will be notified when the work is completed and advised of the proper procedure to obtain your new access equipment. Your present entry cards or remotes will no longer function, and you will require new ones to gain entry. This modification is being done to improve the safety and security of all residents.

Again, we remind you that you MUST obtain approval from both your subdivision and the master association ACC Committee before proceeding with any work or improvements on the exterior of the home. This includes painting, tree planting, installation of fences, pools or patios. Anything that is done on the outside of your home affects the community and you must submit an application, receive written approval before starting any improvements. In the future, violators will be fined, without exception.

Construction is forthcoming at the rear of our complex behind Fairmont. There will be a town home development built by Lennar Homes. Just south of our front entrance, Shelby Homes will construct a warehouse park containing retail showrooms, not stores, and storage rental units. The city of Coconut Creek is moving forward on the design of a downtown area that will include restaurants, stores, movies, even a hotel.

This is progress, this is commerce and business, this is enterprise. It will all have an effect on our Regency Lakes community. Dylan's words never rang truer. "The times, they are a changin', my friend."

From The Dog House

Daycare and Dog Parks

Most homes today consist of two adults who work full time or single people who may work one or two jobs to make ends meet. In almost sixty million of these homes you will find at least one companion animal. Many of them spend endless hours waiting by the door for their human friends to come home.

Well now there is a solution to this pervasive problem—Doggie Daycare. These centers are popping up all over the country and have become very popular with the baby boomer generation.

Activities include group play, agility and behavior training, grooming, nap time, videos, swimming, massages and, of course, snack time. Some facilities even offer a special doggie school bus to transport the lucky canines. The daycare centers usually offer overnight boarding, as well. Most daycare centers require up to date vaccinations, flea, tick and heartworm prevention, and spayed and neutered dogs only. Daycare centers that

have received good reviews are Pompano Pet Lodge, Pet Lovers Central located in Boca Raton, Coral Springs Pet Resort and Petropolis (formally known as Dog Spot) located in Hollywood. Bed and Biscuit located in Coconut Creek caters to small dogs only.

Sending your dog to daycare helps with socialization skills, promotes physical exercise and provides mental stimulation. There are also pet sitting services, if you want someone to come to your house to walk your dogs, and other people who will stay at your house while you are away. There is a central agency called Pet Sitters International (www.petsit.com). Costs for either private pet sitters or daycare centers vary.

For some great exercise for you and your companion animal and a place where you can really bond, there are several parks where you can take your dog for fun in the sun. Most of these parks have separate facilities for small dogs. Your dog should be non-aggressive, be up-to-date on shots, and possess a current rabies

license. Spayed and neutered dogs are preferred, and a female dog in heat is prohibited

Human guardians are expected to clean up after their dog. It's not advisable to bring in any food, either human or canine. Local dog parks include **Dr. Paul's Dog Park** in Coral Springs, **Happy Tails Park** in Plantation, **Snyder's Bark Park** in Ft. Lauderdale, and **Lake Ida Dog Park**, in Delray Beach. **Quiet Waters** in Deerfield Beach and **Tradewinds Parks** in Coconut Creek allow dogs on leashes, but do not have separate areas specifically for dogs.

was evident, wasn't it, when they slipped away to share a joint?





John grabs her and gives her the big-



Broward County Commission Update

County Commissioner Kristin Jacobs says that on average it costs \$8,000 per year to fuel, insure and service a car. "Imagine how much income could be freed up to buy a home or pay for college if each household could get around with one less car. Today, we are making plans to move people—not cars—by improving our transportation system. The County created Transit Oriented Development areas along major transportation corridors. Live-work-play projects will be congregated where a transit system will offer transportation options."

As a director for the Florida Associa-

tion of Counties, Jacobs was recently chosen to serve on a statewide panel to fight for legislation to lessen the property tax burden to renters, home, and business owners.

Jacobs clarified that Broward County taxes are not determined by the County Commission. There are 48 separate taxing authorities in Broward and combined, they control 61 different tax rates. Your taxes are set by 31 cities, the School Board and the County, plus 15 special districts, such as the North Broward Hospital District. What you don't see listed on your bill are taxes collected for the Property Appraiser, Sheriff,

Clerk of Courts and Supervisor of Elections. That's because State law allows their expenditures to be tucked out of sight inside the County Commission's budget. Commissioners have no legal control over how these officials spend your tax dollars. Over the last ten years, the four constitutional officers' budget share has grown from 44% in 1996 to 48% in FY '07. Yet last year the County Commission dropped its tax rate lower than any other Florida county. This year they did it again, dropping our millage rate by 10.66%.
